

Table 4.1. Adult Outcomes: Incorporating the Transition Plan Into the Student IEP

<i>Domain</i>	<i>IEP Planning</i>	<i>Example</i>
Postsecondary training and learning	The IEP should describe the student's plans for a specific targeted outcome, such as to review the application process for community college or university, continue training for an apprenticeship, participate in a preparation course for postsecondary education, or further training.	Kyle is transitioning to his local community college. His IEP includes goals for him to complete tutoring and take placement tests in order to meet the college's entrance requirements.
Jobs and job training	The IEP team should consider how best to support the student's current and post-high school employment plans, through supported employment, work with adult employment specialists and agencies, and/or job coaches.	Claudia's IEP includes a monthly goal to meet with her job coach at PetSmart, where she works part-time. Her IEP describes how she will work with both the coach and her employer to ensure she is fulfilling her job requirements.
Home living	The IEP should delineate the living arrangements for the student, including any benchmarks or milestones (e.g., living with a parent or guardian until meeting a specified goal) if the ultimate goal is independent living.	Maurice's IEP describes needed transportation assistance, vocational training, and supported living to assist him in his post-high school plans.
Community participation	The IEP should support the student's integration into the community by incorporating relevant experiences.	Tizzy's IEP describes specific community activities for her to pursue to keep her involved and connecting to others.
Recreation and leisure skills	Some recreation and leisure activities can assist students with disabilities in their acquisition of related social-emotional and self-determination goals (e.g., job counseling, youth development activities).	Joshua's IEP goals include his once-a-week swimming and participation at the Boys and Girls Club.
